I. STUDENT WORKLOAD ASSESSMENT PROVIDED BY LECTURERS


Bachelor Programme in Management UNDIKSHA conducted a student workload survey to determine learning effectiveness. The questionnaires are distributed to students with the expectation that the results of this questionnaire can improve the performance of teaching staff in providing services to students. In addition, the results of distributing this questionnaire will be able to evaluate the number and method of assignments given to students. Providing a proper assessment workload will help students be motivated to do the assignments without being burdened. With the number of respondents being 683 students, the student responses to the workload given by the lecturers in the even semester 2020/2021 are as follows:

A. The Interval Of Total Individual Assignments Given By The Lecturers To The Students Every Week

The first assessment is about the interval of total individual assignments provided by the lecturers to the students in one week. The results of the questionnaire distribution showed that 683 Bachelor Programme in Management students assessed that the lecturers were still in the category of rarely giving individual assignments to students with a percentage of 44.2%, where the number of individual assignments given by the lecturer was in the interval 1 to 7 assignments. The second-largest percentage (38.8%) stated that lecturers gave 8 to 11 assignments. Compared to the two percentages, 16% students stated that the lecturers often gave high-intensity assignments (12 to 14 assignments). In contrast, the remaining 1% stated that there were still lecturers who never gave assignments to the students. The percentage of individual assignments given by the lecturers to the students every week can be seen in Figure 1.

B. Student Workload Assessment Against The Amount Of Time Given By The Lecturer In Fulfilling The Assignments

Student workloads assessment is not only in terms of the number of assignments but also in terms of the amount of time given by the lecturer in fulfilling the assignment. This assessment assumes that the amount of time for fulfilling the assignments is in accordance with the number of credits of courses taken by students, one credit for 50 minutes. Most of the students gave their opinion that the time given by the lecturer to do the assignment was sufficient (55.5%). In contrast to the previous opinion, 39.5% of students stated that the time to do assignments was not enough with the course credits and students needed more time to fulfill the assignments. However, it was still found that about 5% stated

students could complete their assignments faster than the time given by the lecturer. The illustration of Student workload Assessment against the amount of time given by the lecturer in fulfilling the assignments can be seen in the Figure 2.




C. Student Assessment Toward Group Assignment Provided By Lecturers

In addition to provide the individual assignments, lecturers also give group assignments. It is to improve communication and teamwork skills. From the results of the questionnaire, it can be seen from the number of percentages given by students, about 52.6% of lecturers giving group assignments. Where the lecturers gave group assignments to students with an intensity of 1 to 7 group assignments. As for other opinions from students who stated that lecturers sometimes gave group assignments to students, there were 8 to 11 group assignments (27.2%). Meanwhile, 19.3% of students stated that lecturers often gave group assignments to students (12 to 14 assignments). The remaining 0.9% of students stated that the lecturers never gave group assignments.

D. Student Workload Toward Field Work Given by Lecturers.

The student's workload is not only in the form of assignments. The lectures also give field work to the students. Field Work is carried out as an evaluation of the material provided in the application of economic activities. Field Work is carried out as an evaluation of the material provided in the application of economic activities with the assumption that the completion of the Field Work is 200 minutes per credit. Based on the survey results that have been distributed, it is known that 37.6% of students feel that the

implementation of practical work can be completed in accordance with the completion time given by the lecturer. This has received a positive assessment from 35.1% of students who stated that Field Work could be carried out properly and pleasantly. In contrast, 23% of students stated that the completion time of this Field Work was too long, and the lecturers should re-evaluate this Field Work activity. The smallest percentage of 4.3% of students are still hesitant to assess this Field Work.
